Janna,

The Downtown Infrastructure Improvement Project began as a street project. It included paving and sidewalk improvements and sidewalk crossing improvements. The City of Lowell received two \$100,000 grants (\$200,000 total) from the Oregon Department of Transportation's Special City Allotment Fund.

From a practical and cost savings perspective, it made sense to look at evaluating and upgrading the water lines where needed as part of that project. Some of the City's water lines are very old.

We do not prefer looking at a rate increase in order to meet the required Debt Coverage Ratio. We think it would be preferable to reduce our expenses and I believe it would be Council's preference also.

As I mentioned on the phone, The City enacted a Utility Payment in Lieu of Franchise Fee in June of this year. The Water and Sewer Funds would pay a 5% fee on gross operating receipts to the General Fund for their use of the right-of-way. The Water Fund Fee was estimated to be \$17,776. This fee did not exist before this year and no moneys have been collected to date.

If this resolution is rescinded, I believe it would increase the revenues and meet your Debt Coverage Ratio. I have attached revised proforma showing this fee removed. I have also attached the Resolution establishing the Fee in Lieu of Franchise Fee.
