

Oregon was the first state to adopt a vote-by-mail system (by citizen's initiative in 1998) and has the *highest* rate of voter turn-out in the country. But vote-by-mail still requires registration and that deadline is October 15th . If you're over 18 years old and a US citizen , register at your local US Postal Office or online (if you're new to the area) or confirm your registration online:

Spectator Codes of Conduct

High school sports spectator codes of conduct often include the following expectations:

Be respectful: Treat players, coaches, officials, and cheerleaders with respect. Avoid profanity, degrading language, and gestures. Don't make personal, non-performance related comments about players. Respect the judgment of coaches and officials.

Be positive: Cheer for your team in a positive way. Show appreciation for good play by both teams.

Be informed: Learn the rules of the game so you can be a better informed spectator.

Be a good role model: Avoid actions that offend visiting teams, individual players, and coaches. Encourage other spectators to participate in the spirit of good sportsmanship.

Follow rules: Remain in your designated seating section. Comply with any directives from facility supervisors, administrators, and/or event staff. Observe the rules of local school concerning smoking, food and drink consumption, littering, and parking.

Stay off the playing surface: Stay off the playing surface, including halftime. Don't be on the playing area before the game, at halftime, or during the game.

Avoid noisemakers: Don't use artificial noisemakers, such as ringing bells or sounding horns.

Don't throw objects: Don't throw any objects into stands or onto the event surface.

Stay safe: Monitor the safety of children in the bleachers and stands. Demand a safe and healthy environment that is free from drugs, tobacco, and alcohol.
