Become a Master Gardener™ in 2025

Gardening education and advice is needed now more than ever. The OSU Extension Master Gardener program is training new community educators in 2025, who will help provide advice and support for Oregon's growing community of gardeners.

Master Gardener volunteer training is conducted by local county OSU Extension offices, with support and guidance by the statewide office. Master Gardener trainees will be able to access in person and online classes and participate in local, in-person workshops. Fees for the training program have been reduced, and many local Master Gardener associations are making scholarships available to partially cover the costs of training.

In Lane County, we will be offering classes in Botany, Soils, Plant Disease, Entomology, Edible Gardening, Plant Propagation, Plant and Weed Identification, Native Plants and Conservation, and more.

Applications open are October 1 to November 15.

Middle school cross country had a fun and successful season. Sixth grader Theo Waters set the Lowell Junior High record in the 3000m with a time of 11:09.2. and finished 3rd in one meet with 267 competitors. He and his teammates all showed incredible tenacity and improvement throughout the season.

E-Permitting Now Online

This spring, the City partnered with the Oregon Building Codes Division to join their ePermitting system. As of Monday, October 21, we are now processing building, electrical, mechanical, and related permits completely online. This includes processing payments for permits. We are also processing land use applications online through the sytem. You can access the sytem here:

We will provide over the counter services on a caseby-case basis for customers requiring special assistance. In general, though, all permitting will now be conducted online.

This process will ensure easier record-keeping for the city, as well as a streamlined experience for builders and property owners. The city started this process to comply with a new state law that requires city's to have an e-permitting system online by January 1, 2025.

City Council Approves New Wastewater Facilities Plan

At its October 22 meeting, the City Council approved a new wastewater facilities plan. This plan replaces the previous plan, which is around 20 years old. This has been an over 2-year process, and it involved extensive review by the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality. The master plans for both the water (approved in 2021) and wastewater systems are now up to date.

The next step will be meeting with state and federal funding agencies to explore grants and low-interest loans to fund the recommended capital improvements. To view the new wastewater facilities plan, visit this link:

Floodplain Development Regulations Update

The city participates in the National Flood Insurance Program since many properties adjacent to Dexter Reservoir are in a federally-designated flood plain. Our participation in the program requires compliance with the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) regulations on floodplain development. FEMA has started a process to update those regulations to comply with federal Endangered Species Act requirements that are intended to preserve fish habitat.

At the October 22 meeting, City Council reviewed the options to comply with the new FEMA requirements. One option is to update floodplain development standards to require that new development results in "no net loss" in undeveloped land, pervious surface, and tree coverage. Property owners whose buildings are located in a floodplain would still be allowed to perform normal maintenance on their buildings.

The city will start the notice process to implement the floodplain development standards update, and we will send notice to affected property owners. For more information, visit the FEMA website:

Ties to the Land Workshops Offered

The Forestry and Natural Resources Extension program at OSU will be holding a succession planning workshop series called Ties to the Land, from November 2024 to January 2025.

Ties to the Land is intended for small landowners considering how to pass on their land or associated business. The workshops help participants think through the social, financial and legal aspects of succession. Worksheets help participants refine

their goals, take stock of assets and sketch out a timeline, while case studies bring the lessons home.

The series includes two in-person classes and four optional Lunch & Learn Webinars. Roseburg in-person workshops will be held Friday, November 1, from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. and Friday, January 10, from 9:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. Eugene in-person workshops will be held on Saturday, November 2, from 1-4:30 p.m. and Saturday, January 11, from 9:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m.

Fire Safety Reminders for November

- Open burning season Call LRAPA for Burn Advisory 541-726-3976 Option #3.
- Clean your fireplace and woodstove flue before the really cold weather hits. A clean flue makes your woodstove happy and keeps your home safe.
- Check you smoke detectors monthly. Assure you have a good battery in your detector.
- Be prepared to weather winter storms. Make a kit and stay informed. Be able to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours.

Holidays Safety Reminders

Increase your holiday safety when using candles by following these important tips:

- Blow out all candles before leaving the room or before going to sleep.
- Keep candles away from things that burn. Keep candles at least one foot away from combustibles including clothing, curtains, upholstered furniture, greenery, and decorations.
- Always use a sturdy metal, glass or ceramic candleholder. Make sure the candleholder is big enough to catch dripping wax.

- Place candles out of reach of small children and pets.
- Keep candles out of high traffic areas.
- Trim wicks to one-quarter inch before lighting.
- Avoid candles with items embedded in them such as twigs, flowers or leaves. These items can ignite or even explode.
- Maintain working smoke alarms on every level of your home, outside each sleeping area and in every bedroom.
